5. New/Continuing Business/Action Items:

5.1. County Strategic Plan Presentation

Stafford provided an overview of the County's strategic planning outreach efforts and invited the Commission to offer feedback on priorities for the disabilities community. The Commission identified health and access to healthcare, housing, and economic justice as key priorities and discussed existing infrastructure that either supports or hinders access to programs and services in these areas. Highlights included the need for expanded mental health care and services addressing isolation, enhanced care management, issues related to immigration enforcement, the scarcity of healthcare providers—particularly in South County—and recent challenges with federal food service funding (e.g., SNAP). The Commission requested that staff return in January to continue brainstorming strategies to address these priorities.

5.2. Santa Cruz County Employment Services Awards Report

Liddy Hayford and Molina Then shared information about the 18th annual *Santa Cruz County Employment Services Awards* ceremony multi-agency event held at the Aloha Grill, hosted by several community partners, including Community Life, Santa Cruz City Schools, Pajaro Valley Unified Transitions Program, Hope Services, the Department of Rehab, and San Andreas Regional Center (SARC), to name a few. Eleven employers were recognized for their efforts to employ people with disabilities, including New Leaf Market, CVS, SLV Unified School District, and Freedom Elementary School among others. The event was reportedly well attended, and the ceremony is expected to air on public television eventually.

9. <u>Announcements/Emerging Matters</u>:

Weiglein serves on the Community Advisory Council for Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA). They are interested in learning more about the Commission and collaborating on public-focused (versus school-related) events. They host an accessible Easter Egg Hunt for children in disabilities, which might be a good opportunity. Molina suggested inviting representatives to attend a Commission meeting to share more about their efforts.

Gutierrez Baeza shared that County Park Friends has not been funded in a while and County Parks has told them not to fundraise on their own or to host events outside of County Parks' programs. At the same time, Parks has not been able to host any events or programs for lack of funding. Wheelchair basketball had to be canceled because Parks could not fund it and County Park Friends were not allowed to seek private funding for the event.

Staff reported a County Government hiring freeze and emphasized the recent funding cuts to safety net programs that address essential community needs, such as food insecurity. Commission was encouraged to consider aligning their priorities to match the current fiscal climate in an effort to maintain their relevance with the Board of Supervisors.

Santa Cruz County Strategic Plan 2032 — Focus Areas

1. Housing & Infrastructure

Focuses on supporting *affordable housing* and the basic infrastructure that makes stable communities possible. This includes implementing Regional Housing Needs Allocation goals, improving roads, water and sewer systems, enhancing permitting processes, and aligning efforts across jurisdictions to support housing stability. <u>Santa Cruz County</u>

Alignment with County work & plans

- Built Environment Departments: Community Development and Infrastructure, Environmental Health, General Services
- Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA) targets and implementation.
- Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for roads, water, sewer, and permitting modernization.

What we are hearing from community

- Housing affordability is foundational; roads, water, and permitting are critical enablers.
- Desire for visible progress on basic systems that people experience every day.
- Stronger alignment across jurisdictions to support stable, affordable homes.

2. Community Care and Resilience: Access to Services & Support

Aims to ensure people can access safety-net programs and support systems that keep them housed, fed, and connected to care. Key elements include connecting residents with services like food support, healthcare access, and homelessness response while reducing barriers like language and transportation. Santa Cruz County

Alignment with County work & plans

- Safety Net Departments: Human Services, Child Support Services
- Housing for a Healthy Santa Cruz (H4H) and homeless response coordination.
- Safety-net programs: Medi-Cal, CalFresh, IHSS, APS/CPS; Master Plan on Aging.

What we are hearing from community

- Keep people housed, fed, and connected to care; reduce barriers across systems.
- Improve service navigation and language access, especially in South County and rural areas.
- Make support visible and reliable for families, older adults, and people experiencing homelessness.

3. Health, Wellbeing & Connection

Prioritizes community health and social connection. This includes streamlining access to health services (including behavioral health), promoting affordable care, improving wait times, and creating welcoming public spaces (parks, community centers) that foster wellbeing and connection across all ages. Santa Cruz County

Alignment with County work & plans

- Health and Wellbeing Departments: Health Services Agency, Parks and Cultural Services.
- Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) and Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA) Plan.
- Master Plan on Aging; Parks' inclusive spaces that support social connection.

What we are hearing from community

- Access, wait times, and affordability are key concerns, particularly in South County and rural areas.
- Wellbeing depends on connection: safe, welcoming places (parks, libraries, community centers).
- Pro-social supports for youth; reduced isolation for older adults.

4. Safety & Justice

Emphasizes *fair*, *preventative*, *and community-focused public safety*. This involves supporting diversion and reentry programs, enhancing trust between communities and law enforcement, and balancing accountability with compassion. Encourages practices that reduce harm and increase fairness in the justice system. <u>Santa Cruz County</u>

Alignment with County work & plans

- Public Safety Departments: District Attorney, Probation, Public Defender, Sheriff-Coroner
- Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) Annual Plan; diversion, reentry, alternatives.and

What we are hearing from community

- Safety is about fairness, prevention, and connection—not enforcement alone.
- Compassion with accountability; rebuild trust in communities.
- Support for survivors, youth diversion, and neighborhood problem-solving.

5. Environment, Climate & Sustainability

Centers on *protecting and strengthening natural systems* and preparing for climate-related impacts like wildfire, flooding, heat, and water quality issues. Related work includes implementing the County's Climate Action & Adaptation Plan and hazard mitigation efforts to support long-term sustainability and quality of life. Santa Cruz County

Alignment with County work & plans

- County Departments: Agricultural Commissioner, Agricultural Extension, Community Development and Infrastrucutre, Office of Response, Recovery, and Resilience, Environmental Health, Parks
- Climate Action & Adaptation Plan (CAAP) and Hazard Mitigation Plan.
- Measure Q Vision Plan; Local Hazard Mitigation Plan.

What we are hearing from community

- Wildfire, flood, water quality, and heat impacts—especially in rural and mountain areas.
- Value of parks, clean air and water, and preparedness for quality of life.
- Desire for investments that protect people and places over the long term.

6. Economy & Job Growth

Focuses on *building an inclusive, sustainable economy* with strong job opportunities and pathways. This includes workforce development, supporting small businesses, strengthening career pipelines (e.g., collaboration with Cabrillo College and UCSC), improving wage outcomes, and ensuring that economic growth connects with housing and transportation. <u>Santa Cruz County</u>

Alignment with County work & plans

- County Departments: Auditor-Controller-Treasurer-Tax Collector, County Clerk-Elections, Human Services, Human Resources, Information Services
- Workforce Development Board Strategic Plan and County economic development.
- Career pathways with employers, Cabrillo, UCSC, COE; broadband and hubs.

What we are hearing from community

- Close the gap between wages and cost of living; more local opportunities to live and work here.
- Support small businesses and entrepreneurs; strengthen job readiness.
- Grow pathways in high-demand sectors while connecting work to housing and transit.
