1. Call to Order:

Meeting was convened at 12:33 pm

3. Approval of October 12, 2017 minutes:

4. Additions/ Deletions to Agenda:

- 5. Public unscheduled presentations and announcements to the Commission:
 - a.) Taylor congratulated Saldana on receiving an award from the ACLU. Saldana will be honored at a ceremony/reception on Sunday, January 14, 2018 at 2:00 PM at the Peace United Church of Christ located at 900 High Street, Santa Cruz. All Commissioners are invited to attend.
 - b.) Daugherty shared his disappointing experience in confronting numerous transportation obstacles which ultimately prevented him from attending Intern Angelica Victoria's Capstone Presentation at CSUMB. A discussion regarding similar service deficiencies followed. Daugherty encouraged Commissioners to write letters documenting issues to transportation agencies.
- 6. Staff Report: A recruitment for a new Commissions Coordinator has been launched, and many applications have been received.
- 7. Commission Reports:
 - a.) Metro/ Measure D: Daugherty reported that there has been discussion regarding restoring services and purchasing new vehicles/ParaCruz buses. Some routes that were cut two years ago have been restored due to increased funding from Cabrillo College student bus passes.

Daugherty explained that Measure D is utilizing sales tax revenue previously available for other purposes; however, no further cuts in services are planned.

- b.) Social Media: No report.
- c.) Employment: No report.
- d.) History: No report.
- e.) Legislation: Saldana will report on Governor Brown's proposed budget's impact on persons with disabilities once she has gathered more information.

f.) IHSS:

- i. Magana reported that Governor Brown developed a conservative budget to ensure a "honey pot" in the event of "rainy days."
- ii. Saldana reported that Governor Brown's proposed budget includes \$10.6 billion for the IHSS program in 2017-2018, representing a 6.5 percent increase over the revised 2016-2017 level; the proposed increase in the Counties' share of the cost of IHSS will likely result in a considerable impact to County finances.
- iii. Victoria announced that there is a helpful training available for persons receiving IHSS in San Jose through Parents Helping Parents.
- iv. Saldana encouraged Victoria to apply for the District 3 vacancy, and Taylor announced that she will compose a letter of recommendation for Victoria.

g.) Education:

- Victoria will present her Capstone presentation to the Commission at the February 22, 2018 meeting. Victoria provided a synopsis of her research and project which focused on local schools' failings to assist monolingual Spanish parents in navigating and understanding the special education system.
- ii. Magana described local efforts to "Train the Trainer" to improve advocacy, awareness, and accessibility within the school system and provided an overview of Pajaro Unified School District's transitional aged-youth education and career planning efforts.

8. Subcommittee Updates:

- a.) Recreation:
 - i. Crosse provided an update regarding a Leo's Haven Inclusive Playground Project/Chanticleer Park meeting. The Packard Foundation is making a monetary contribution. Crosse anticipates that breaking ground on the playground should happen soon, since 75% of the project's budget has been raised.
 - ii. Saldana requested an addition to the next meeting agenda to approve a letter regarding changes negatively impacting DeLaveaga Park's accessibility.
- b.) Accessibility Awareness: Taylor will hold a study session at the March Commission meeting to brainstorm ideas for Accessibility Awareness Month events in October. Taylor requested this item be added to the March meeting agenda.
- c.) KUDOS Awards: No report.
- d.) Housing: Saldana reported that there is a rent control movement gaining momentum within the City and County, including advocating for a rent-freeze and a limit to the permissible bases for tenant eviction. Saldana announced that the issue will receive comment at the January 23, 2018 City Council meeting.
